To support Red Nose Day, Langley Park School for Girls has linked with Comic Relief Charity and created a donations page where money can be pledged for fun activities. We have already seen and heard of students' fundraising activity in support of Comic Relief (and Red Nose Day, which takes place today – Friday 20th March).

To ensure all students have the same opportunity to take part, we are encouraging students to set up their own fundraising activities outside school which will generate donations they pay directly into the justgiving page (link shown above).

The fun does not stop there; every student who participates will gain a point for their House for their efforts and the winning House will have the most students participating. To receive a point for the House each students must put their full Name and House on the Just Giving page when they donate.

A list of possible suggestions for activities are shown below:

- Sponsored Silly Walk/Dance: Challenge family members to a sponsored "silly walk" or a dance-a-thon in red clothing or costumes.
- "Nose and Spoon" Race: Similar to an egg and spoon race, but using a red nose on a spoon, trying to navigate an obstacle course without dropping it.
- Picking Noses: Place several red noses in a bowl and use chopsticks or a wooden spoon to fish them out within 30 seconds.
- Funny Face Photo Booth: Set up a booth with props like oversized glasses, hats, and red noses to take silly photos, charging family members for each picture.

Why are we supporting this charity? Because right now, growing numbers of people young, old, entire families are living in fear. Fear for their safety, that they won't be able to meet their basic needs. That is one serious problem we can do something about - Together.
