Dear Families,

It has been a wonderful week for the Performing Arts, with the Langley Park Centre for the Performing Arts hosting this year's Langley Festival of Music. Our students performed superbly alongside peers from across the trust in the MAT Orchestra and the IMAT Piano Recital Evening, demonstrating great musicianship and collaboration. On Monday evening, we were also delighted to celebrate the efforts and achievements of our second cohort of Year 7 students participating in our Instrument Scheme, recognising their dedication to learning a musical instrument this term. This week has been an important one for our examination groups with our Year 13 Drama students completing their performance exams and our Year 11 Dance students recording their Non-Exam Assessment pieces. We are extremely proud of the hard work shown by all students involved.

Wednesday marked the first round of auditions for Langley's Got Talent, a competition for Year 7 students from LPGS and Langley Park School for Boys. With such a wide range of acts stepping forward, I certainly don't envy our judges — and I am beginning to think we may need to introduce a "golden buzzer" next year! It is wonderful to see students sharing their passions so confidently.

Our Year 12 Politics students enjoyed a highly informative visit to both the Houses of Parliament and the Supreme Court on Monday. The experience offered a valuable insight into the workings of our political and judicial systems. We extend our thanks to the Rt Hon Liam Conlon, MP for Beckenham and Penge, for kindly hosting our students in Parliament, answering their questions, and providing such an engaging discussion.

We were very pleased to welcome pupils from Langley Park Primary, Hawes Down, and Clare House for our annual Trust Primary Science Festival. Key Stage 2 students took part in a wide range of hands-on scientific practicals and investigations in our laboratories. A particular highlight was seeing our science student leaders guide, support, and inspire the younger pupils—a brilliant example of leadership and community in action.

My thanks, as always, to the parents who joined us for our SEND Parents' Forum, led by Mr Chinery, Mrs Sweeney and Mrs Ashman-Clark. The partnership between school and home is central to ensuring our children flourish, and your engagement and insights are invaluable to us.

Families will have received important information from Bromley Public Health regarding meningitis, following recent reports of meningococcal disease in Kent. This information has been shared with all Bromley schools and parents/carers. In addition, Mr Chinery (SESCO) and I wrote to families regarding fidget toys and the school's position on their use. Thank you for your understanding and support with this.

Next week we will be publishing our termly newsletter. As we approach the end of term, I would like to take this opportunity to wish all those travelling to Canada on the ski trip a safe and thoroughly enjoyable experience. We also look forward to welcoming Year 11 and Year 13 students to the in-school revision sessions taking place throughout the break.


